

The Lighting of the Advent Candles

Why is tonight different from all other nights?

Tonight is the Eve of Christ's birth, and the night we light all the candles on the Advent Wreath.

Why do we light candles?

Their light symbolizes the coming of God's light into our world. Each week before Christmas, as the world moved into deeper darkness, we lit another candle to proclaim God's light.

What is the meaning of the candles?

**The purple and rose candles represent the *true* gifts of Christmas—hope, peace, joy, and love.
They have reminded us how to prepare our lives for Christmas.**

As we begin this holy night, let us light these candles and open our lives to receive God's gifts. And let us open our hearts to share those gifts with others.
