## Pastor's Message

---

Dear Friends,

Summer is almost here! With it often comes a different pace of life. School is out. The days are longer. It's a chance to take a breather, be it with an extended vacation or just a three-day weekend.

The season often provides us a chance to catch our breath as a church, too. The 8:30 Contemplative Communion moves outdoors to breathe the clear air of an early summer morning. The 10:00 Sanctuary Choir takes a summer breather, as we offer a variety of special music offerings each Sunday (including Santa Fe Opera Apprentices, youth and adult soloists from our own congregation, and three "Drop-in Choirs"). Children's Ministry moves outdoors for Creation Care and the Children's Garden. Our Sunday Forums continue, but we'll also offer regular opportunities simply for food and fellowship after worship.

Whatever your summertime plans are, I hope it's a time to catch your breath and also to breathe deeply. Whether you're on the road this summer or enjoying Santa Fe, take time to do each day what we do every Sunday at United—i.e., take time to *breathe*.

*Breathe* in God's peace. Peace that is not simply the absence of conflict, but a strong, sturdy peace. Peace that is deeply rooted in the awareness of God's presence in your life. Peace that can withstand the storms and outlast the dry times. A Piñon Tree Peace. Breathe it in deeply every day this summer.

*Breathe* in God's hope. Not just optimism that everything will be okay or turn out like we want (because it often doesn't :-). But hope that is grounded in the trust that God is with you. Hope in the assurance of things you often can't see—that you are held in God's heart and in the prayers of others. Hope that, like desert plants and creatures, you will have what you need to get through the dry times and the hard times. Wherever you are this summer, breathe in that Desert Faith Hope.

*Breathe* in God's love. Love that is more than a mere emotion that fades like dew in the morning sun. God's love that can overcome our fear and confusion. God's love that can get us up in the morning to face whatever the day will bring. God's love that finds us wherever we are. God's love that even death itself could not defeat. God's love that, like a hidden stream in a desert, offers us new life.

God's peace. God's hope. God's living-water-love. Those gifts will go with you wherever you travel this summer. Take time to breathe them in deeply.

They also speak the truth to our time and our lives. This summer, we'll explore these songs of hope and honesty and the stories behind them.

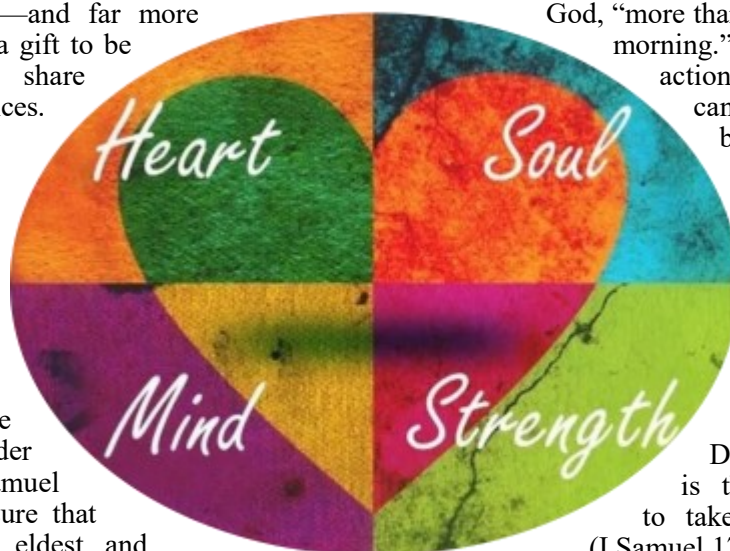

### *Known, by God* June 2

"O Lord, you have searched me and known me," affirmed the composer of Psalm 139. "You know my rising up and my lying down. You discern my thoughts from afar and art acquainted with all my ways." But what does it mean to be "known" by God? Is God like Santa Claus, knowing always who's naughty and nice? Or is God's knowledge of us something far different—and far more lifegiving? Perhaps it's a gift to be known, by God. We share Communion in both services.

### *Soul Strength* June 9

"On the day I called, you answered me," proclaimed the composer of Psalm 138, "you increased the strength of my soul." But what role do we have in that soul strengthening? An earlier Psalm (130) answered that question with the affirmation, "I wait for the Lord, my soul waits, and in God's word I hope." In fact, the Psalmist asserted that his soul waited for God, "more than those who watch for the morning." Strength can come from action and engagement, but we can also strengthen our souls by waiting for God, trusting in God's presence; and strengthen that muscle called hope.



### *Look on the Heart* Father's Day June 16

When it came time to anoint a new king for Israel, God told the prophet Samuel to choose one of the shepherder Jessie's eight sons. (I Samuel 16:1-13) Samuel was sure that God would want the eldest and strongest, but God told the prophet, "Do not look on the appearance or height, for the Lord does not see as mortals see; they look on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart." Perhaps that's part of a father's job description—to "look on the heart" of his children. Who has looked on your heart?

### *Finding the Faith That Fits* June 23

David, a mere shepherd boy, is the only person willing to take on Goliath the giant. (I Samuel 17:1-40). King Saul tries to suit the boy in his own armor, but it's too big and bulky for David's small frame. Instead, the boy goes to meet the giant with five smooth stones and his sling. And he prevails. Perhaps the story of David and Goliath is factually true. Perhaps it tells a deeper truth about finding a faith that fits.

### *Girded with Gladness* June 30

Psalm 30 is one David could have written, not David the shepherd boy but David the mighty king who was laid low by his own decisions and hubris. "I cried to you, Lord, and you helped me," the Psalm proclaims. "You brought up my soul from Sheol, restored me to life from among those gone down to the Pit." Even though David had turned from God's ways and suffered the consequence, he also knew that God had turned his "mourning into dancing," took away his sackcloth and clothed him with joy. David knew this wasn't cheap grace, but a gift that required him to come clean about his life. Only then would he know the joy that comes in the morning, the healing of soul and spirit that can only come from God.

# Music

Our music program will soon switch to the summer schedule, and we have a wonderful variety of special music planned! Once again we'll be graced several times by soloists from the Santa Fe Opera Apprentice Program. And while Jessie is in Asia visiting family, we'll be blessed to have Jacquelyn Helin subbing for us. In addition, the summer music will include special appearances by musicians from within the congregation, as well as our Choral Scholars.

Here's the schedule for this month. On June 2 we'll have our first Drop-In choir. All are welcome to come and learn a new piece at 9:00 am to sing in the 10:00 service. On June 9 Jack Smucker, a son of the congregation, plays an unaccompanied cello piece by JS Bach. On June 16 we'll enjoy our first apprentice, singing "Great Is Thy Faithfulness." That Sunday is also the first Sunday Jacquie will be playing. The following Sunday Jacquie offers a piano solo as our special music. And on June 30 our second apprentice sings "The Lord Is My Light." We are indeed blessed to have so many musical resources in our congregation and wider community.

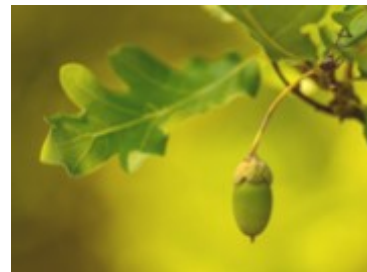
